

Biography

Dai Qing was born Fu Ning in Chongqing Municipality in 1941.

Her ancestral home was Linchuan, Jiangxi Province.

Dai Qing graduated from Harbin Military Engineering College in 1966 and began working as an engineer in a top-secret laboratory specializing in the guidance and propulsion systems of intercontinental missiles.

From 1982-1991, Dai became a reporter and columnist in the *Guang Ming Ribao* (Enlightenment Daily). As a professional reporter and writer, Dai Qing has been awarded the Nieman Fellowship at Harvard University; a Freedom Forum Fellowship at Columbia University Media Studies Center; a Woodrow Wilson Fellowship in Washington DC, and a Contemporary China Center Fellowship at the Australian National University.

Dai Qing was awarded the National Reportage Award in 1982 by the Chinese Writer's Association, the Golden Pen for Freedom Award in 1992, and in 1993, the Conde Nast Traveler Environmental Award and Goldman Environmental Award, Taiwan Cross-Strait Cultural and Educational Exchange Essay 1st Prize for "My Hansheng Friend" in 1998.

Dai Qing started publishing in 1979 and became a member of the Chinese Writers Association in 1982. Her works include short stories collections *No* and *The Last Oval*; essay collections *The Soul* and *Expel The Devil and Clasp onto God*; historical reporting *Wangshiwei and the 'Wild Lilies, Chu Anping and 'Total Party Domination'* and *Contemporary Chinese Intellectual: Lang, Wang, Chu*; collections of interviews *Conversations with Scholars*; oral history collection *Contemporary Chinese Women* (co-author); and various articles and books outside of Mainland China, including *My Four Fathers, Being a Prisoner in Qin Cheng, ! and ? An Eyewitness of The Hei Longjiang Forest Fire, Yangtze! Yangtze! The Controversy over The Three Gorges Dam Project*, and *The River Dragon has Come! The Three Gorges Dam and the Fate of China's Yangtze River and Its People*, and *In the Palm of Buddha's Hand: Zhang Dongsun and His Era* (Chinese Edition), and *Deng Xiaoping in 1989*, New Century Press, 2019.
